





MEDICAL CAMP



International District Rotary 3234 organized a free medical camp on December 18, 2024, from 10 am to 2 pm at Navy Nagar, as part of its ongoing efforts to enhance community health. The event was inaugurated by Rtn. N.S. Saravanan, the District Governor; Rtn. Vinod Saraogi, the District Governor Elect; and Rear Admiral RK Dhingra, VSM, Flag Officer Commanding, Tamil Nadu & Pondicherry Naval Area.



Several hospitals contributed to the success of the camp, offering essential healthcare services to the community.





The Sundaram Medical Foundation Hospital played a vital role by providing doctors for general screenings, assisted by two nurses and two social workers. In total, 92 members from families of Navy officers received medical screenings, with medicines worth Rs. 8,500 distributed to patients. 
STEP PROGRAM

As part of its community service initiative, "STEP" (Support Therapy to Educate People), Sundaram Medical Foundation (SMF) successfully conducted an online session titled "Chronic Idiopathic Constipation and Abdominal Gas" on Saturday, December 28, 2024. The session aimed to raise awareness about constipation during Constipation Awareness Month.

Dr. Rajan Babu, a distinguished Gastroenterologist, delivered a comprehensive presentation that covered a wide range of topics, including Causes of Constipation, Types of Constipation, Dietary Recommendations, Medications and their role in treating constipation, Types of medications, mechanisms of action, and potential side effects

The online session was well-received by the audience, with 55 participants actively engaging throughout the presentation. Dr. Rajan Babu's informative talk provided valuable insights into constipation and its management, addressing a common yet often overlooked health concern.

The "Chronic Idiopathic Constipation and Abdominal Gas" online session was a valuable contribution to community health education, raising awareness about constipation and offering practical guidance on its management. YOGA SESSION







FREE MEDICAL CAMP





The Rotary Club of Madras, in collaboration with Sundaram Medical Foundation, successfully conducted a free medical camp on December 26, 2024, in T. Nagar, Chennai. This initiative provided comprehensive healthcare services to 106 beneficiaries, including free examinations, consultations, and medications. The camp focused on addressing common health issues like diabetes and anemia, while also emphasizing the importance of preventive healthcare and regular check-ups

Notably, many beneficiaries have continued to utilize the camp's services on a monthly basis, demonstrating the significant impact of this initiative on improving community health. **Rtn Dr. Vijaya Bharathi and Rtn KK Raman** visited the camp, which offered a range of medical services, including blood pressure checks, blood glucose tests, hemoglobin tests, and general screening tests. Medicines worth Rs. 5,600 were distributed among the beneficiaries.
