CANSTOP

CANSTOP (Cancer- Support Therapy to Overcome Pain) is an out-reach program of Sundaram Medical Foundation, Dr. Rangarajan Memorial Hospital. Dr.Vijaya Bharathi Rangarajan is the founder of CANSTOP. She is the Trustee & Director of Sundaram Medical Foundation. It is a charitable organization, now entering its 27th year of service, extending its services to patients of lower socio-economic background in government hospitals totally free of cost. It is involved in helping cancer patients and their families by providing counselling, awareness programmes, free screening camps, medicines for deserving patients, etc.

In commemoration of World No Tobacco Day, CANSTOP is organizing a series of impactful events throughout the month of May 2025 to raise awareness about the dangers of tobacco.





AWARENESS TALK



On May 23, 2025, a free medical camp and health talk were held at Apex Covantage, Guindy, for employees. The event offered free health check-ups, screenings, and advice from doctors, helping employees understand and take better care of their health. The next day, on May 24, 2025, a program called STEP (Support Therapy to Educate People) was organized to spread awareness about oral cancer and the dangers of using tobacco. Dr. Jagadeeshwari and Dr. Senthilnathan led the session, explaining how tobacco can lead to dental problems, gum disease, and oral cancer. The dental department organized the event, and 54 people attended, showing strong interest in learning about oral health. Both events helped raise awareness and encouraged people to take better care of their health.

SCREENING CAMPS

CANSTOP organized several free medical camps offering oral and general health screenings, specifically targeting slum areas, gypsy communities, and metro workers. These camps provided essential health services, including free check-ups, screenings, and medical advice from a team of dedicated professionals. The initiative was an important step in promoting health awareness and helping the community make informed choices about their well-being. Dental kits containing a toothbrush, toothpaste, and tongue cleaner were also distributed to encourage good oral hygiene practices.

cases identified and
referred for further
treatment.

Due to the overwhelming number of requests, we were not able to cover all the intended camps within the month. In response, CANSTOP is committed to continuing these health camps into the month of June, ensuring that more communities receive the care and support they need.

















STICKER CAMPAIGN

On May 31, 2025, a sticker campaign was held at the Chennai Central Auto Stand to mark World No Tobacco Day. A total of 300 stickers were placed on autos to spread awareness about the dangers of tobacco use. The campaign had a strong impact. Thanks to the involvement of cancer survivors and mothers of children affected by cancer, who volunteered for the event. Their participation added a personal and emotional touch, helping highlight the real-life effects of tobacco and encouraging a tobacco-free lifestyle.



BRUSH TOBACCO OUT

A painting competition titled "Brush Tobacco Out" was held on May 24, 2025, at SMF OPD, Mogappair, as part of the World No Tobacco Day awareness campaign. The event saw enthusiastic participation from 56 school students aged 5 to 15, using art to raise awareness about the harmful effects of tobacco.





All participants received certificates of appreciation. Awareness sessions were also conducted for parents, focusing on cancer dangers and health education tips to promote family wellness and a tobacco-free lifestyle.


